The Guild is saddened to announce the death of John Hallberg Jones, who was one of the reorganizers of the Guild on 8 Nov 2011

John was a permanent member of the Advisory Council of the Hereditary Society Community of the United States of America (the HSC). This established to facilitate organization was the reliable operation of hereditary and lineage societies in the United States. John was also one of the original incorporators of the HSC.

Mr. Jones was member #246 via Frances (Deighton) Williams, MA, through David, Matilda and Mary.

Ona Marlene (Rathbun) Wilkinson 26 Sep 1932-18 Nov 2023

The Guild is saddened to announce the death of Ona Marlene (Rathbun) Wilkinson, who was one of the reorganizers of the Guild on 8 Nov 2011.

Marlene had a keen interest in genealogy and spent her post retirement years researching the Rathbun and Wilkinson families, among others, developing a rich and detailed lineage and family histories. She was a member of over 73 lineage groups and held offices at both the local and national levels. In 2001, Marlene received the Community Service Award from the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution for her years of service to her community. In 2015, she was inducted into the Hereditary Society Community of the United States of America ("HSC"), recognizing her society leadership, membership, service, tenure, personal character, and life-long accomplishments.
